Waterworks Project

For the local historical archaeology enthusiasts we have an opportunity to help excavate the 1882 Waterworks building. Nine 1x1 units have been established. These need to be dug and sifted, in the hopes to define the configuration of the machinery which once was operating in the room, to find signs of cultural activities of that era and to discover other 'treasures' which may be hiding in the fill dirt.
