## **Llama supported Field Trip to Grand Gulch, Utah**

The Denver Chapter of CAS has invited us to join them in a llama supported trek to Grand Gulch, Utah. Date is September 2-6 and the cost is \$800.

Grand Gulch on Cedar Mesa is a beautiful canyon carved out by an intermittent stream (snowmelt from Bears Ears). It has not been occupied for more than 1400 years. Nearly every south facing alcove contains a cliff dwelling and granaries of rock art.

Grand Gulch is in a Primitive Area which means that it is closed to all vehicular travel. For people who don't backpack, but can walk a llama trek, this is ideal. On this trip they plan to explore the middle part of Grand Gulch. The daily mileage will be 5 miles with opportunities for longer explorations.

The special price is \$800 per person for 8-9 people or \$895 per person for 5-7 people. Price includes llamas, all camping equipment, including double occupancy tents, sleeping bags, bag liners, pads, all food and guide, cook, wrangler and tips. The llamas will also carry 14 pounds (not more) of personal possessions (clothing, toiletries, etc.) in a soft sided duffel(s).

Lecture summary: The Early Upper Paleolithic Burial of the Lagar Velho Child and Implications for Admixture Between Neanderthals and Modern Humans.

The burial of a four-year old child who died 25,000 years ago was discovered in the Lagar Velho rock-shelter (Lapedo, Leiria, Portugal) in December 1998. The extensive use of red oche, the ornaments worn by the child and the presence of food offering align this population, culturally, with the contemporary Gravettian Europeans. The child's anatomy, however, indicates that, biologically, his folk were descended from extensive admixture between Neanderthals and anatomically modern humans occurring at the time the latter entered Iberian regions south of the Ebro River ca. 28,000 years ago.
