## February Meeting

Our February 16<sup>th</sup> program will be presented by one of our scholarship recipients, Terry Ritzman. Please mark this date on your calendar and plan to come and show your support.

Terry is a third year graduate student in the MA program at Colorado State University. He is specializing in physical anthropology, specifically human evolution. Other interests within anthropology include archaeology, specifically zooarchaeology and taphonomy. During his last two summers, he has excavated with his advisor, Dr. Michelle Glantz, at Anghilak Cave, Uzbekistan. Last summer, Terry spent a field season working at a Paleolithic site in the Republic of Georgia. His thesis research is a taxonomic reassessment of the Teshik-Tash child, a fossil discovered in Uzbekistan in the late 1930's. Terry plans to complete his Master's degree in May and will start a PhD program in the fall.

**ABSTRACT:** This study is a preliminary taphonomic analysis of the faunal assemblage collected during excavations at Anghilak Cave, Uzbekistan during the 2003 field season. Anghilak Cave is a newly discovered Middle Paleolithic site in the Kashkadariya region of southeastern Uzbekistan and has been preliminarily dated to 27,000 (uncalibrated) ybp. The analysis quantified surface modifications and revealed the spatial patterns of such modifications. Additionally, baseline zooarchaeological data was collected. Results indicate that the assemblage is highly fragmentary, predominated by shaft fragments of medium-sized ungulates and contains firm evidence of both human and carnivore modification of bones.

## Code of Ethics

Members who exhibit artifacts will do so in an educational context. Items from burials and objects considered sacred will not be exhibited.

Members will cooperate with the State Archaeologist and other agencies concerned with archaeology and related fields.

Members will respect the dignity of groups whose cultural histories are the subject of archaeological investigation.

Members will not participate in conduct involving dishonesty, deceit, or misrepresentation about archaeological matters.
