## Death and the Family: Testing Andean Lineage Relationships through Cranial Non-Metrics

**October 17 (Wednesday)** - No-host dinner from **6:00-7:00 pm** in the basement room of Wild Boar Coffee, 1501 S. College, Fort Collins. Program begins after a short business meeting at **7:00 pm**. Program: **Sarah Herrera**, CSU, 2nd year Anthropology graduate student, presents **Death and the Family: Testing Andean Lineage Relationships through Cranial Non-Metrics**.

The Huari-Ancash project is a collaborative effort and field school headed by Bebel Ibarra, PhD University of Paris, France that has excavated many Peruvian sites. One of these, Marcajirca, is a residential and funerary site at 3,800 m in the north central highlands of the Ancash region. The project focuses on the human remains found in over 35 above ground tombs or *chullpas*, about 23 funerary caves, and 2 unexpected underground burials. The site spans a very critical transitional time during the Late Intermediate Period with radiocarbon dates ranging from AD 1040-1640. As part of the project's bioarchaeological

analysis, Sarah's thesis explores the bio-distance of the remains from the site. Through analysis of the frequencies of cranial non-metrics, she plans to test whether different tombs represent distinct lineages in space and time. Her talk presents 5 years of bioarchaeological data found at Marcajirca, preliminary findings from the biodistance analysis and implications for understanding Marcajirca and Andean pre-history. Sarah Herrera is a 2nd year Anthropology student at CSU. She received her B.A. from Brigham Young University with a minor in Spanish that has greatly aided in her ability to conduct research in South America. This spring she received the Alice Hamilton scholarship which helped make her research in Peru possible. She is currently working as a field tech for Centennial Archaeology Inc. This program is free and open to the public. Please join us!

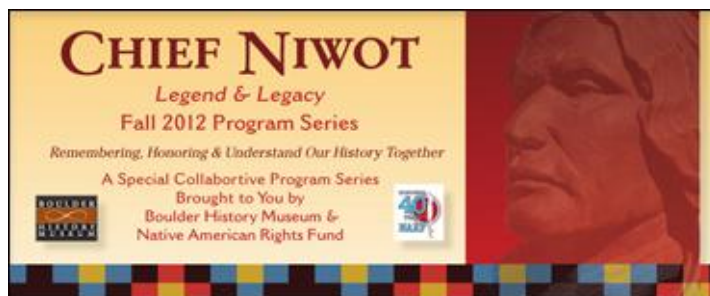

## Colorado Archaeological Society Code of Ethics

- Members will uphold State and Federal antiquities laws and regulations.
- Excavation of archaeological sites will be conducted only according to professionally accepted procedures developed in consultation with a professional archaeologist and with the written permission of the landowner. The investigator has the responsibility for publication of the results of his/her investigation and for making the collection available for further scientific study.
- Members are encouraged to report archaeological sites to the Office on the State Site Report forms. Materials collected from the surface sites shall be catalogued and described in the site survey report. Collected materials should either be deposited with the State Archaeologist's office or made available for scientific study.
- Members will not support illegal or unscientifically conducted activities by participating in or condoning the sale, exchange or purchase of artifacts obtained from such sites.
- Members who exhibit artifacts will do so in an educational context. Items from burials and objects considered sacred will not be exhibited.
- Members will cooperate with the State Archaeologist and other agencies concerned with archaeology and related fields.
- Members will respect the dignity of groups whose cultural histories are the subject of archaeological investigation.
- Members will not participate in conduct involving dishonesty, deceit, or misrepresentation about archaeological matters.

Submissions are welcome and are used at the editor's discretion and may be edited for content, length, and format. Common submissions include book reviews, event announcements, volunteer help requests, activity reports, and local news items. Please follow the guidelines below. Contact the editor with any questions.

- Submit materials by the 1st of the month. The newsletter is published during the first week of the month so events or activities which occur early in the month should be submitted for publication in the prior month.
  - Include contact information in the form of a name, email address, web site, and/or phone number.
  - Illustrations can be used but they may be reduced in size and/or resolution to reduce file size.
  - Event announcements should include specific time and location information, remember not all members live in Fort Collins or even Colorado.
  - Clearly distinguish your own content from that created by others so that proper credit can be given.
  - Submit all material electronically. Acceptable document formats include Microsoft Word documents and plain ASCII text files, as well as plain text in the body of email. Acceptable image formats include .jpg, .tif, and .bmp. Adobe PDF files also can be used. Tables can be sent using Microsoft Excel or embedded in a Word document.
